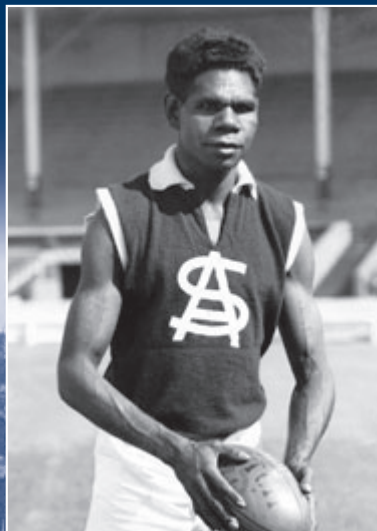

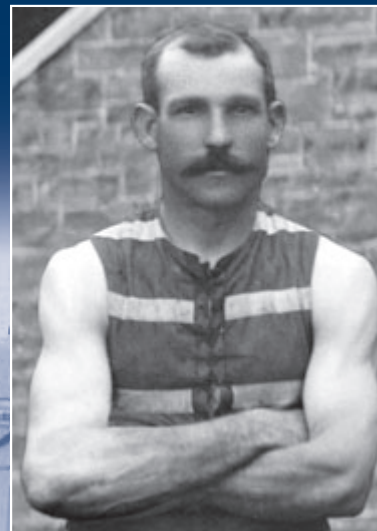
Alan Hickinbotham

Alan played 45 games for SAFC and the state as a dynamic centre-half-back, and then had a distinguished involvement as chairman of the club, and with SANFL, for over 25 years.



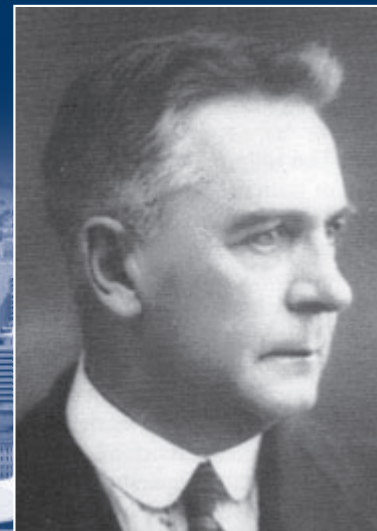
David Kantilla

Originally from the Tiwi community, the high leaping David (Amparralamtua) won the Knuckey Cup in the first two years of a memorable 113 game career, including the 1964 GF.



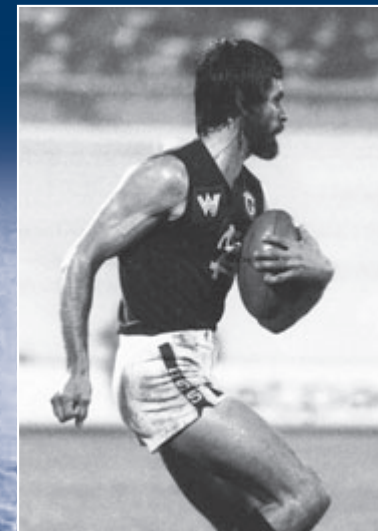
John 'Jack' Kay

Jack played in five South Adelaide premiership sides in the 1890's as a talented full forward who was the leading goalkicker in the state for 3 years and club captain twice.



Frank Marlow

Frank was a great advocate of junior football who served as secretary of SAFC during the period of the club's greatest success from 1894-1911, then as SANFL secretary from 1912-1935.



Stuart Palmer

Stuart played a record 337 games for SAFC, was a member of two Escort Cup premiership sides, captained the club from 1982-1984, and later served as chairman.
